

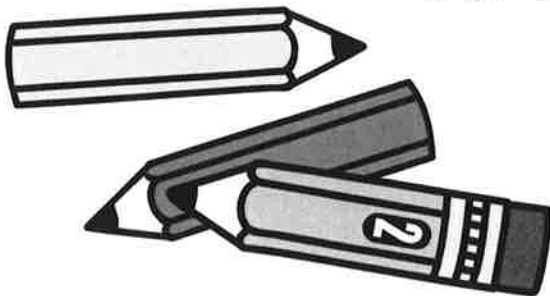
LOGIC PUZZLES FOR BEGINNERS

Logic puzzles are a great way to wake up the brain and test one's ability to think clearly. They can be challenging but most of all, logic puzzles are really fun!

Tips for students:

- Read the introduction to see what needs to be solved.
- Use the grid like a detective's notebook to record the information you know to be true.
- Read through all the clues and fill in the facts that you discover as you go along.
- Look at the grid to see if you can figure out anything from the clues you recorded.
- Then go back and reread the clues to see if you can find any new information. Often, you will be able to use clues or find new information that was not usable the first time.
- Use deductive reasoning. That means you should only use what you know is true to figure out the answer.
- Guessing or using opinions might give the wrong answer.
- If you use the clues given, you can solve the puzzle.
